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The Phenomenal 50s

A old account of Spring Garden Church's past.

In this story of the early days of Spring Garden Church, we want to tell you of the devotion to God's work, the dedication from the members, touching events, humorous bits, a few near disasters and some of the accomplishments. His people know without God's care and love, progress could not take place. Facts and figures have been recorded in the Church Records and in Cornerstone Memories which can be borrowed from the Resource Centre.

There are achievements and stories to touch the heart, the warmth of friendship, the feeling of being at home in the church. These are personal to all of us and must be inserted by each one through our memories.

There was tension in the air! The Happy Kind! All through the short service one could sense, almost breathe in the excitement generated by the small congregation who were going to vote. There would soon be a Convention Baptist Church in the small town of Lansing, soon to be renamed Willowdale.

When private homes became too small for the growing number of attending prayer meetings at the Baldock and Gill homes - Ed Gill mentioned to Reg.



Hewitt of the Legion Hall that it had become necessary to seek larger premises. Mr. Hewitt said: "You've got the Hall". Well, it was partially built but we could rent the basement for \$20.00 a Sunday. Evening services began but it wasn't long before we had a morning service, a Sunday School and an evening service.

Deacon Dobby Dobson gave us a good laugh one Sunday morning. "How are you Dobby?" "Well I'm fine but my arms are tired, fanning you know, beer odours, and cigarette smoke from Saturday's frolic by members of the Legion."

Mr. Ted Gill and Mr. Walter Baldock were anxious to build a Sunday School where the children would obtain a good grounding in Bible and Worship. Talk about being unstinting with your time, these two men and their families were a perfect example.

One of our treasured memories is of our daughters coming home and demonstrating how Ted Gill led the singing with verve and joy. How the children loved Ted Gill! He was wonderful with children and staunch worker for his church.

Meetings were held twice a week and for any expenditure a special meeting had to be called. Money was very scarce. Young couples were building their houses or buying new bungalows and it was often difficult to find a dollar for Sunday collection and a dime for your children in Sunday School. One day a meeting was called suddenly. We required more hymn books for the following Sunday. So it was authorized that we should spend \$6.50 for hymn books.

Another time a meeting was called to authorize the cost of a rubber stamp which would simplify the secretary's work. Una Baldock was Secretary for the Church for twenty-five years, Secretary for the Sunday School, a member of the Choir and a teacher. The church honoured her and made her the Official Historian. If you ever have a reason to look at the Church Records in the McMaster Divinity College Archives you will see how diligently Una carried out this service. (One must have written permission from our pastor to see the Archive Records.)

This is definitely a story of growth in Christ, everyday happenings that gave heart to the people and strengthened their faith in God who answered prayer.

Ann Cross and her husband started a choir. They and their daughters sang beautifully and we were fortunate to have this

gifted family present cantatas and concerts with the small early choir.

Let me tell you a story about the children who are our future. Our first Christmas Party was held in the Hall. Children must have been anticipating it and passed the word at school. Two little girls and their cousin remember "the place was packed". One lad who had been appointed "curtain puller" for the program of colourful pageantry was so enthusiastic that he grabbed the curtain - or so he thought, and flew through the air well into the middle of the stage. The young audience howled. He rolled up to a standing position, gave us all a big grin, bowed and left the stage. How the children loved it! They went home very happy, carrying their brown bags of an orange, nuts, and candy. They fully appreciated the solemnity of the Wise Men visiting Baby Jesus and the singing of carols and choruses.

Progress in growth and planning was evident from Sunday to Sunday. One day shortly after our meetings in the Hall began Mr. Percy Ward suggested that we start a Building Fund. What faith that small core of people expressed. Many of us wondered where the money would come from. Oh Ye of Little Faith! We should have known better. Guarantors pledged their money. We had money from the sale of the Glen Forest property. Our first Pastor, Mr. John Mildon lived in the house Glen Fores had owned. You see these two churched jointed together. We took over the paying of full salaries within the year. Talk about opening doors. God was good to us - He gave us men with great business acumen, far sighted-ness and an enormous wish to further God's Kingdom on earth.

Two ladies had been appointed very early on to organize a woman's work. Margaret Gill and Marg Alexander. Lanter on both Margarets admitted they want to hold the first meeting in their home. That did not spoil their friendship - on the contrary both wanted to see a Mission Circle established and Margaret G. helped the other become acquainted with Baptist Missions.

It was soon clearly understood that the women attending the meeting were eager to form a Mission Circle. We did not conduct much business - it was our first social time together. We were getting to know each other. Within a very short time we had two Mission Circles and a Women's Organization. The women gathered together the first medical supplies to go to overseas missions and, as well, supplies to needy groups locally. They started a White Cross Group - bandages, dressings and so forth. One group made beautiful guilts and sold them to our church ladies. Not too many and the proceeds were given to the needs of our church.

Mrs. Gill and Mrs. Baldock were early presidents and Mrs. Dolman and Georgina Roberts were capable and gracious leaders later on. We had talent to draw on so that it seemed that our needs were taken care of and that God was our Caregiver and our Guide. A knowledge that gave a feeling of great thankfulness. The church continued to grow steadily - but as a child, feeling its way and adding to its knowledge of needs and growth. Inevitably it showed signs of growth in faith and fellowship, a steady growth of interest in missions and neighbourhood outreach. The records show that in those early years a few new members were accepted month after month. Funds were low and meeting obligations was far from easy.

This small pulpit or lectern was used when our services were held in the Legion Hall. The lectern, possibly made by a member, is from the York Mills Baptist Church established in 1840, and whose roots go back to 1829. Early members of Spring Garden, Mr. and Mrs. Ira Gooderham and Miss Bathgate, came from families who helped establish the early Baptist work. The only part of the early church in existence today is a small cemetery near the property of St. John's Anglican Church, York Mills. The lectern was used at the entrance to our church for many years and more recently at the back door for registration purposes. It is now undergoing some slight repair work and this bit of our Baptist

history in Willowdale (Lansing) will, we are sure, be put to good use.

In 1952 one project was to outline the duties of Boards and Committees to avoid confusion and overlapping. A church constitution was required - a hoped-for reality for 1953. This was not be until the next decade.

"Spring" as the young people affectionately call our church as been so very fortunate over the years. God has blessed us with fine dedicated pastors.

Rev. J.K. Mildon October 1949-October 1953 Rev. J. Slimon November 1953-March 1957 Rev. W.V. Sturgess June 1957-August 1968

We could tell pages of stories of the achievements in the church under our capable pastors and leaders. Not only was a church built in the first year, but by 1958 we began to plan an extension for a much large edifice. We were an established church and progress was almost unbelievable as we review the things accomplished.

And now for a few of the serious and the humourous happenings - it is good to remember the lighter side of the hard work and efforts of the faithful few.

The day after the cement foundation was laid, we had a heavy rain which caused the north wall to bulge inward to a considerate degree. Fortunately they were able to re-align the wall without noticeable damage...

Spring Garden Anniversary



As I think about anniversaries, I think of a time to reflect on what has happened in the past, a time to celebrate and a time to dream about the future. I came to Spring Garden in 1996 following a time of pain in my life. My marriage had recently ended and I needed a place of healing where I could share my story or just be a part of the fellowship without feeling obligated to share any details.

Spring Garden became that place for me. Although I lived in Bowmanville I was driving to work in Newmarket five days a week to work in Southlake Regional Hospital. My daughter was attending Spring and invited me to come. "You drive to work, why not drive to Toronto on Sundays?" she asked me. So began my 28 years at Spring.

One Sunday stands out for me with such clarity. Margie McLaverty, the minister's wife, was speaking on 'The Father Heart of God'. Suddenly I found my heart opening in places of deep woundedness - and tears began to pour. I sat there sobbing - not feeling like I had to run and hide in a bathroom. Suddenly a friend sat down beside me and wrapped her arm around my shoulder. It was a pivotal moment in my healing, as God used the fellowship and acceptance of friends and the Love of God as demonstrated by the church to begin to heal the deep wounds I carried.

Shortly after I came to the church I heard about a 0600 Prayer Time on Sunday mornings. Several of us came together on the chancel steps to pray for the three services that would be held that day and for the needs of those God brought to our minds. The thought brings back the warmth of those times. After a short term mission trip to Armenia, Colombia, I felt a pull to pray for that community and the ministry of Shalom Iglesia. I asked the church leadership for permission to pray each Friday morning at 0600 in the church. They agreed and gave me the information for the alarm and requested that I add prayers for Spring Garden Church as well.



changed into Refresh

- a wonderful group

of women who met each Wednesday morning. We provided child care and invited all to come and be part of the relaxed group where we studied the

Bible and prayed for each other. Over the years we had many newcomers to Canada join and bless us before they moved on.

Tanya Salituro provided the leadership and I was privileged to assist and support her. We went as a group to houseclean the kitchen at the Oasis Food Bank and ministry at Dufferin Baptist Church. We had made up and donated to Oasis, 'birthday bags' that contained the decorations and cake mix and icing and candles for families to have birthday parties for their children.

When the pandemic shut down meetings in the church we began to meet on Zoom, with Bev Holtzman, Jen Chrystman and me leading, for prayer and fellowship and Bible study.

This year we faced the reality that we needed to look at what God was saying about Refresh and the noon hour Bible Study on Thursdays that Victoria Shipmaker had been leading for several years. As we prayed God led us to form the present group that meets the first and third Thursday of each month - Lunch, Prayer and Share. We meet to share our life's journeys and challenges, to pray for each other and to explore what God wants to say to us from the Bible. Once again, we welcome all women - young and old to come. We have several for whom English is not their native language and we are all enriched by the love we feel for each other and the wonderful love God shows us each time we meet.

I love to sit near the back of the church on a Sunday morning to see the mosaic of cultures and ages that make up our church family. It is inspiring to see how God has brought us together to grow into a loving community. As I listen to the sound of the children and youth leaving to go to their worship downstairs, I reflect on how blessed we are to have wonderful volunteers and dedicated pastors who value children - not as the future of the church, but as an integral part of the church family.

So what is my dream for Spring Garden Baptist Church? I see us continuing to be involved in the community - through our involvement with Neighbourlink North York, continuing to welcome new-comers to Canada to become part of our church family and to reach out to our neighbours, to continue to be a presence in our own neighbourhood.

I see us valuing art and creativity as that team create worshipful themes to draw us into meditation and thoughtful response. I see us growing to know God better through the themes of the sermons on Sunday mornings and the Home Groups that encourage us to pray for each other on our life's journeys. I see our yearly Retreat growing to include more and more of our church family in a relaxed weekend together, of Bible teaching and campfires and fun.

I see us opening up the doors of the church to the community so that our building becomes a place that is open and active every day - not just on Sundays. I envision a kitchen that has been modernized to Public Health standards where we could provide a space for individuals to be able to cook and create to sell or share the food they prepare. I would love to see us providing hot meals for the homeless or under housed and even being a shelter from the cold for individuals who are marginalized and often without resources.

These are big dreams, but that is what dreams are, isn't it letting our imaginations carry us to places that stretch us beyond our comfort zone. They allow our Wonderful God to show us - as He has over the past 75 years, that Spring Garden is His house, and we are His cherished children - His hands and feet in a hurting world.





Recommendations

Before the library was created, we had a tape library (sermon tapes etc.) and a Book Rack which began in 1973. A committee was then formed to create a resource facility with a "meaningful selection... of study materials for elective leaders, Bible study leaders, teachers, etc. and to provide leisure reading". There was also a priority to create a children's library. Ruth Thompson spearheaded this project. (1973/74 annual report). 300 books were purchased for the library the first year, and by 1978 there were 1000 books, and 2200 by 1979. (Close to what we currently hold in the library now).






Little songs for little souls: 30 favorite Bible songs






Field notes for the wilderness: practices for an evolving faith, by Sarah Bessey
