

What do you long for?

Over the last few weeks, I have been reminded how much I dislike the cold and in turn, I have been surprised by the extent to which this dislike exercises an uncanny power over me. I know this may sound ridiculous but oftentimes it seems that my dread of the damp, dark cold weather looming outside my window is more effective at jolting me out of my sleepy state than my own blaring alarm. While my alarm may initially disturb my slumber, it is the thought of the bitter cold that awakens my semi-conscious body and activates my lethargic senses.

Such a dislike stirs in me a deep longing for warmer, sunnier days, a longing so strong that sometimes it's hard for me to distinguish whether my stomach is turning because it is hungry or because I desperately don't want to leave the comfortable warmth of my bed and confront the grim elements beyond the walls of my apartment. Comical, I know, and perhaps a little exaggerated; nevertheless, I have found that reflecting upon my experience of Canadian winters and my consequent longing for the arrival of warmer, sunnier days to be fertile ground for deeper reflection.

In particular, I have been asking myself, "What do I long for most? What is it that I set my sights upon and strive towards?" Such selfreflection has reminded me how often I chase after things like personal success and achievement, the approval and acceptance of others, and individual happiness and comfort, all in an effort to satiate my desire to have my belovedness affirmed-I want to know that I matter, that my life counts for something more regardless of whether I am able to prove so to others. To clarify, it is not that any of the things I mentioned—achievements, acceptance, happiness, etc.—are inherently bad; rather, it is that in them I hope to find deep joy and satisfaction in the face of my deepest longings. That is, my longings have misdirected me towards things that do not draw me toward God, the only One who is able to satisfy my deepest longings. Perhaps you find this to be the case in your life as well as you wrestle with pervasive and insatiable longings and desires?

The Lenten season, beginning on February 14th and going until March 28th, offers an opportunity for us to pause and intentionally take time to consider what it is we long for most and how and where we seek to satisfy these longings. It is a time that compels us to journey with Jesus as He journeys to the cross, learning from Him as One who abided in the love of the Father and in turn, demonstrated His love for humanity by laying down his life. As we walk alongside Jesus, we will have a chance to observe that in spite of the pervasive allure of securing power, attaining wealth, or relishing in fame, He repeatedly set His eyes beyond the temporary pleasures of the present moment and sought that which would truly satisfy: to know and be known by His Father, doing that which He was sent to do.

As the winter persists, showing no sign of relenting in favour of warmer days, it often seems like the summer months that I long for will never come. I find myself drifting all too easily into despair as I pitifully conclude that my bed is the only thing that will satisfy my longing for warmth, even if I know it is temporary and terribly inadequate. You may laugh because this seems utterly ridiculous; yet, in a similar vein, how often do we settle for temporary fixes and passing pleasures because they promise to satisfy that which we long for most?

Jesus, His journey to the cross, and His act of self-emptying love invites us to cast our eyes beyond our present circumstances and to hold fast to a hope that is beyond anything we can conjure up ourselves. To be sure, this is not a solution to our present troubles, so as to say we will never experience pain or never wrestle with unsatisfied longings; rather, as we journey with Jesus to the cross, we are reminded that there is something greater than what we presently experience, struggle through, and long for. With these things in mind, let us allow this Lenten season to be a time when we bring our deepest longings before God, learning to abide more fully in His love and trust that it is He alone who can satisfy our deepest longings.

Lent as Alternative to Empire

Come, everyone who thirsts,
come to the waters;
and you that have no money,
come, buy and eat!
Come, buy wine and milk
without money and without price.
Why do you spend your money for that which
is not bread,
and your labor for that which does not satisfy?
-Isaiah 55:1-2a

Some of you will remember these TV ads from AT&T. They featured a winsome young teacher or librarian sitting at a table with young children. He engaged them in friendly talk through a series of questions. The questions of course led to the conclusion that we should buy AT&T products. But the teaching addressed to the viewer through the children was this: it is better to do two things at once rather than only one thing at a time. Bigger is better. Faster is better. More is better.

This poem of Isaiah is a wake-up call for us when we have been nearly talked out of faith by the force of empire, when we have wanted to prevail instead of trust mercy, when we have decided to gut it out rather than let the pardon come, when we have bought in to the phoniness of the AT & T ad rather than the God of the gospel who gives free gifts. Lent is a question, a gift, and a summons.

The questions of Lent are:

What are we doing?

Are we working for that which does not satisfy?

Are we spending for that which is not bread?

The gifts of Lent are free, gifts in the gospel that sustain life: free wine and milk, free water and bread, and all the markings of sacrament that refuse our thin attempts at empire.

The summons of Lent is to bear new fruit. Do what is in sync with the God of the gospel, the God who has another intention for our lives, who wants us out of the rat-race of "big is better" and so has mercy, who gives us pardon when we do not do enough by doing two things at once.

We are left with a new sense of ourselves as God's people:

no longer working for that which does not satisfy; receiving good gifts that we need for life; engaging in a new productivity of that which heals and transforms.

This could be, for any one of us, a return to our true self after almost being talked out of it.

You are the God who disrupts our lives with an invitation. During this season of Lent, may we stop and may we start again: may we stop our strivings marked by greed and anxiety, may we start again the work of compassion and generosity. Amen.


Here is what we will be talking about on Sundays! WOW! | A 4-Week Series On Jesus' Miracles:
