Prayer as Primary Speech by Sam Lee


I came to Canada in 1987 when I was 10 years old without knowing more than a few words in English. Toronto was less diverse back then compared to what it is now. My elementary school had one other Korean student but she didn't speak any Korean. I remember going to my ESL classes and being aware that I had no idea what people were saying. It wasn't long before I learned how to speak the language and although I can still speak Korean, English has become my main language. It is the language I think in, pray in, and dream in. Yet there are certain words, certain phrases that can't capture quite right the meaning or the "essence" behind that word unless it's in my mother tongue. For instance the word 눈치 (noon chi). It means something along the lines of social awareness but still doesn't get to the essence of the word which is the ability to tell how someone is reacting to a social situation and how the other person is feeling. It's hard to explain in English.

In a similar way, prayer is the mother tongue of all people and is, as Ann & Barry Ulanov put it, our primary speech. It is the primary speech that connects us to the living God. It is that foundational and primordial language where we speak out of the depths of who we are (whether or not we use words is another thing). This primary speech speaks heart to heart, soul to soul, and is the revealing of our whole selves - the good, the bad, and the ugly - to a God who cares, who listens, who knows us better than we know ourselves.

So it is with this thought that we want to encourage you through our current Sunday morning series to engage with your mother tongue, with your heart language. Take time to pray, to listen, to just be with God. Know that God is the one who is listening to you and though your words may not be able to express everything you are feeling or wanting, God knows and is with you in your ramblings, in your crying out, in your silence. God wants to hear from you and remember that God also wants to speak with you.

Till the end of November, we are going through the different postures of prayer as a way to pray to God who knows and understands our mother tongue. On our website, under the heading "more," you will see a page with Spiritual Practices to help guide you in praying. May you engage with the God who loves you, who knows your heart, and who is ready to listen and to speak.

Another Season of Growing in the Community Garden

Partnership with St. Clare's Residence

This year we were able to make ten bi-weekly deliveries of fresh produce from our Community Garden to St. Clare's Residence which is just north-east of SGC on Bayview. St. Clare's provides transitional crisis housing and support for up to 30 women. They have been extremely appreciative of each of our modest harvests, and it has been a blessing to be able to partner with them this year. Thank you to the many individuals who volunteered in a variety of ways to allow this to happen!

Welcoming Space

In addition to assisting with the practical need of providing fresh food for those in the community facing food insecurity,

the Community Garden also creates a space that welcomes people from the community in and meets them where they are at. Community members are often observed interacting with the garden in a variety of ways, although there is not always contact or interaction so we don't always know how the space is impacting them but we see that it is.

Eva Sham recounts one experience she had this year: 'One summer day, I dropped by our Community Garden





to see what should be done. While weeding, I heard someone talking. I walked over to investigate because the tall tomato and cosmos plants had hidden the person from my view. I saw a young woman sitting on the bench talking on her mobile. She explained that she had come for some solitude during her lunch break from work. I am glad that our Community Garden provides a quiet space for folks who live or work nearby. May they encounter the living God during one of their quiet moments at the Garden.'

Challenges

While we had numerous challenges in the beginning, from the unseasonably hot then cold weather, plants dying or not even germinating, to an invasion of aphids, there is a silver lining. Even though these challenges are somewhat annoying, they also help to connect us to the people that grow our food, and to appreciate their hard work and the hurdles they face, and to appreciate each individual fruit or vegetable that we eat. As one of our volunteers, Colleen Stevens, remarked, 'The key to food stainability is knowing where our food comes from. How many fast food restaurants do I know vs how

many farmers do I know?' Colleen also appreciated the experience of learning how to grow, eat and enjoy our own locally grown produce with others in our neighbourhood.

Treasure Hunt

When harvesting fruits and vegetables I like to think of it as a treasure hunt. Partly because it's true (they like to hide!), partly to make it fun, and partly to make us think. When we start to look at each cucumber and tomato as a treasured individual that required care and perseverance by a

person with a name to grow it, instead of a never ending mass at the grocery store, it leads us to think about larger issues. Issues like how much food ends up wasted and how might we demonstrate our appreciation for the work of the farmer, thankfulness to God for the gift of food, and caring for God's creation. Reducing our food waste is one place to start.

Practical Tips for Creation Care

One way to do this is to eat things often thrown away. Think of how much waste is created when you cut up a watermelon! Jin Lee suggests cutting up the watermelon rind (mostly the tender whiter part) to use as a substitute for cucumber.

Leftover coffee? Instead of dumping it down the drain make this delicious chocolate cake!:

(and if you take a few minutes to ask Google, there's a multitude of other ideas you could experiment with!).

Food distribution (such as connecting food with someone who can use it before it spoils) is a huge challenge...and now there is technology to help us! Ben Kielstra recommends the 'Too Good to Go' app where you can connect with food retailers (ie grocery stores and restaurants) in your neighbourhood to buy excess food at a reduced cost. It is a bit of a surprise but that is part of the fun!

So while the season of growing food in the SGC Community Garden has come to an end for 2023, may the garden continue to grow gratitude and care for God's gift of creation in our hearts and minds for many seasons to come.

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

For us to provide our ministry to the children of our church, we require new registration forms to be filled by their families every year as part of our policy to protect.



We've come across a book that we believe would be valuable and worth reading for parents of children desiring to foster their faith. **Book Suggestion: Woven:** Nurturing a Faith Your Kid Doesn't Have to Heal From - by Meredith Miller

In Woven, Meredith Miller offers her perspective on parenting children in the Christian faith. Instead of focusing on obedience and strict rules, Meredith emphasizes the importance of nurturing a faith based on trust and a genuine relationship with God. Drawing from her experiences as a pastor

and parent, the author challenges the traditional obedience-training models, suggesting that faith is more like a web, woven strand by strand, rather than a wall built brick by brick.

Woven encourages parents to create space for their children to explore the Bible, ask big questions, and develop their faith genuinely so they can adapt and grow over time and in the midst of what challenges their faith both now and/or later when they're older.

Meredith also offers tangible tools, suggestions, and examples to

get started in nurturing faith at home holistically. The book serves as a guide for parents who wish to foster a resilient faith in their children, one that is rooted in love and trust in God rather than a rigid set of rules. Our faith is one that our kids don't have to heal from as they grow older, and that's what we find valuable about it. Woven is a valuable resource for parents seeking to pass on a faith that is both deeply rooted and tenacious, allowing children to encounter and know God genuinely and choose to follow personally.








Mother God by Teresa Kim **Pecinovsky**




Every season sacred: Reflections, Prayers, and Invitations to Nourish Your Soul and Nurture Your Family throughout the Year, by Kayla Craig

As parents, we're tasked with nurturing and guiding our children, even as we navigate our own wonderings about faith. In the overwhelming and constant

demands of life, is it possible to tend to our own souls and to our family's flourishing? With tender curiosity and contemplative wisdom, Every Season Sacred is a weekly invitation to grow spiritually alongside our children. Blending thoughtful musings and practical resources, author Kayla Craig meets parents right where they are, offering honest and

hopeful reflections for every season of the parenting journey; encouragement to parent with intention and imagination, presence and purpose; and open-ended discussion prompts and prayers to explore and practice as a family. Every Season Sacred is an invitation to ask big questions, embrace faithful rhythms, and experience God's mysterious, loving presence together. You don't have to have all the answers—and if we're honest, many answers aren't ours to have. This is the beauty of faith.



Woven: nurturing a faith your kid doesn't have to heal from, by Meredith Miller

In this inspiring parenting book, learn how to create space for your children to get to know God in a way that focuses on trust instead of a list of rigid rules. Most Christian parenting books are ready with exact practices every family should follow in order to raise obedient children. In this obedience-training model, faith is a wall, constructed brick by brick, as adults tell children what to believe and how to behave. But what if obedience is

not the goal of Christian parenting? What if it's our job as parents to instead help our kids get to know God and discover that God can be trusted? And what if faith is not constructed brick by brick, but rather woven strand by strand? Much like a spider's web, in which anchor strands and internal threads combine to form a unique web, Woven can help children anchor to who God is and have faith practices that are rich, textured, and all their own. Kids need space to explore the Bible, ask big questions, and even change their understanding of God and faith along the way. With Woven, families can nurture the kind of faith that can flex and grow, be broken and repaired. This is the sort of faith that can stand up to the life a child will live, the doubts they will encounter, and the questions that will come up along the way.
